The afev is a charity that offers academic and cultural support to children.

- **The teacher or chief education adviser** chooses right after the start of the school year children who might need an afev support.
- **The child** need to be voluntary and motivated to learn and discover.
- **Parents** are free to accept or not this assistance.
- **The afev** gets volunteer students in touch with the families. Coordinators make sure that each support goes smoothly.



- **An adult of the family presence** at home is **essential and obligatory** when the student comes.
- Parents need to **welcome** the student and encourage contact with the child.
- Exchanges between parents and the student will make the child's support easier as well as the connection with the school.

CAUTION! A parental permission must be signed:

- > In case of **an exceptionally absence of the parents.**
 - > For any **outing the child goes with the student.**
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THE SCHOOL

- The teacher **explains afev's offer to** the supported child and his/her parents
- The teacher can **meet the afev student** to talk about the child support.

THE STUDENT

HIS/HER COMMITMENT?

- He/she commits **to help** freely **the concerned child**.
- He/she comes **each week** at home **for about two hours**, depending on his/her academic obligations (schedules, exams...)
- He/she comes at least **from November to April**.
- He/she must make sure to establish **good relationships with the family**.



HIS/HER TASK?

- Helping the child to **understand his/her homework** and **using games** to make the comprehension easier.
- Giving advices on how to be **more organized in work**.
- Suggesting **cultural discoveries** through **outings** or **creative activities**.





FURTHER INFORMATION ABOUT OUTINGS!

- Afev outings are **free for the student and the child**.
- They are essential to **pique the child's interest** and to encourage his/her **desire of discovery**.



- They can be good opportunity to go to **games library**, to **bake**, to **initiate into boxing**, to listen to **the Auvergne's orchestra**... as well as meeting other children and their student.

- The student and the child have also the chance to go freely to **swimming pools**, **museums**, **cinema** (Le Rio), attend Graines de Spectacles' **shows** and **sporting events** (football, hockey, basketball).

- **Taking a walk**, **bike ride**, **playing football** in the neighborhood park can also be good ways to take a break from working, in order to come back to work more peacefully later.
